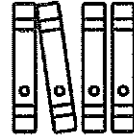

Specially trained in trauma-informed care, Emergency Advocates assist women, men, and children immediately following a crisis. Advocates provide emotional support, information, options, and follow-up services to victims and their loved ones, and remain with a victim for as long as needed.

shelter is a comfortable, attractive home with facilities for 26 women and children. We also provide shelter for men or LGBTQ individuals who do not feel comfortable staying at our shelter.

Families who leave the emergency shelter and desire a supportive living environment also have the option of applying for transitional housing apartments before stepping out on their own.
