

Careers in Technology\* helps individuals, age 17 and older who are unemployed, underemployed, dislocated, and incumbent workers, to gain the skills needed to have a career in the technology industry. In as little as eight weeks, those who qualify for the program receive skills training and the opportunity to earn industry recognized credentials to get their career started on the right foot. The program provides financial assistance for tuition, books, and exam fees. Individuals also benefit from job-readiness and soft skills training as well as job placement assistance.
